The major negative impact of globalization and current economic models in the region is the widening gap between rich and poor and increased levels of poverty in virtually all countries of the region—even those previously considered “developed.” Need more knowledge/education/information are key regional issues

At the core of any sustainable answer to the challenges facing this region remains the need to strengthen people’s participation in local, national and international decision-making processes, and to promote accountable and inclusive governance.
