Terms and Conditions for the Designation

Terms and Conditions

1. By submission of this application, herein referred to as the applicant, and Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks agree to the following terms and conditions:
2. That all the information contained herein is correct to the best of my knowledge. I understand that should information contained herein be found to be false or misleading, it is understood that it will be grounds for dismissal from enrollment at Goodwill Ambassador and that any credits earned while at ADN may be forfeit.
3. All application on-line, all the information submitted is treated as confidential and will only be forwarded to the admissions to Team of Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks.
4. I have read and understand all of the above listed terms and conditions and that by submission of this document I agree to all of the above listed terms and conditions.
5. The World For World Organization (WFWO) has lunched in the occasion of the World Aids Day 2006, of enlisting the volunteer services and support of prominent individuals around the globe of policy maker, parliamentary and academic or other fields of public life who has the capacity to stand up with WFWO take action to support their country locally or nationally and entertainment to highlight priority of development issues and to draw attention to its activities. The WFWO have designated such individuals as Goodwill Ambassadors for Development Networks (ADN). The Executive President and Board Director of the WFWO has invited a number of high profile individuals to serve as Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks (ADN). Our experience has proven that celebrities can contribute to WFWO activities to support and implement the United Nations Millennium Development Goals Objectives (MDG's) targeted by 2015 and

take all efforts to raise awareness of the aims, objectives and priorities of the Organization, to convey messages about its activities and to extend its public outreach. Due care must therefore be exercised in making such designations and in managing the resulting relationships to support her/his country and communities to achieve and implement the MDG's objectives .

6. To ensure consistency and the maintenance of a high standard in the selection, designation and involvement of prominent individuals in the activity of the WFWO and support her/his country, the Executive Board Director of WFWO has approved the following guidelines which shall apply to the Executive Secretariat of the WFWO.

Definition and Selection Criteria

7. Individuals designated by the Executive Secretariat of the WFWO shall be given the title of Goodwill Ambassadors. Individuals designated by the review committee of the WFWO will have the title of Goodwill Ambassador for Development Network (ADN).

8. Individuals invited to serve as Goodwill Ambassadors for Development Network (ADN) shall:

- (a) Possess widely recognized talent in the development issue, education, health, food security, environment, social activities, public awareness, or other fields of public life;
- (b) Be persons of integrity who demonstrate a strong desire to help mobilize public interest to support on the purposes and principles of the WFWO objectives, and who demonstrate the commitment and proven potential to reach out to significant audiences, including decision makers;
- (c) Possess the personality and dignity required for such high level representative capacity;
- (d) Normally be influential beyond their national borders, thus having the ability to promote the values of the WFWO and policy and development activities locally, nationally;
- (e) Be knowledgeable about WFWO goals and activities and clear terms of reference and will be under general supervision of the Executive President of the WFWO and be able to articulate them.

Selection and Designation

9. The WFWO Divisions hereof may designate Goodwill Ambassadors for Development. However, he/his shall inform the Executive President and Review Committee of their intention to designate an individual as Goodwill Ambassador before any commitment is made, not less than four weeks prior to the announcement of the designation.

10. On notifying the Executive President and Review Committee of the intention to designate a Goodwill Ambassador, an explanation of the reasoning behind the designation shall also be provided, along with specific proposed and confirmation that the appropriate review to determine suitability has been conducted.

11. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development are not considered WFWO staff members and may not be appointed to an established WFWO post or office. Therefore, they shall not be granted a WFWO "Letter of Appointment".

12. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development shall be granted a "Letter of Designation" issued by the Heads of the designating Executive Review Committee of the WFWO Offices and Goodwill Ambassadors for Development shall be granted a "Letter of Designation" issued and approved by the Executive President of the WFWO.

13. The "Letter of Designation" shall set out their terms of reference and length of designation. A standard attachment to the "Letter of Designation" shall provide details regarding their status and entitlements, as described below.

14. Designation of a Goodwill Ambassador for Development is to be considered rare and exceptional. The designating WFWO Review Committee, should ensure that the number of designees is not excessive, in order to maintain the value attached to the designation.

15. An individual shall not be designated Goodwill Ambassador for Development by more than one country representatives at the same time.

16. Requests for the participation of Goodwill Ambassadors (ADN) activities shall be made through the designating WFWO Offices in charge or on line.

Role of Goodwill Ambassadors for Development Networks (ADN)

17. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development may at the invitation or request of the designating WFWO Review Committee or the Executive President, as appropriate, engage in public advocacy; fundraising where authorized and in accordance with the applicable regulations, rules, policies and procedures of the designating WFWO Review Committee or other WFWO Division Program and in public awareness activities. They may participate in certain WFWO events and visit WFWO operations in the field if is requested.

18. The designating WFWO Review Committee or WFWO Team Program or the Executive President, as appropriate, is responsible for establishing specific terms of reference for individual Goodwill Ambassadors for Development.

In general, however, Goodwill Ambassadors for Development (ADN) are expected to:

- a) Respect the impartiality and independence of the WFWO and to refrain from any conduct that would adversely reflect on the WFWO;
- b) Refrain from any activity incompatible with the purposes and principles of the WFWO;
- c) Exercise good judgment and discretion in all matters relating to the performance of their functions for the WFWO ;
- d) Obtain guidance on their specific activities from the Head of the relevant WFWO Division Team or Programs and/or staff assigned to liaise with them.

Conditions and Eligibility

19. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development shall be designated for a period of one year, renewable, based on mutual agreement by the parties on the basis of satisfactory fulfillment of the role and their demonstrated interest in continuing the relationship.

20. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development shall not be paid a salary or indemnity or insurance, only although resource mobilizations or fundraising program provided by the country representative "Goodwill Ambassador for Development designated " for funding a project in he/his country, in this case will be submitted an clear proposal and agreed by both parties as consultant services paid under the program may be granted to he/his. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development may be given travel and daily subsistence allowances when they are traveling on behalf of the WFWO (only if the project funding sponsored by the

Goodwill Ambassador designated in he/his country representatives or co-financed and approved and requested by the WFWO Management Team).

21. The official activities or performing services for the WFWO as per item 20, the Goodwill Ambassadors for Development are considered as having the status of "Advocacy special consultant on Mission" for the WFWO within the meaning of WFWO policy and guidelines agreed and approved by designated her/his country representatives as Goodwill Ambassador for Development (ADN).

22. As "Advocacy special consultant on Mission", Goodwill Ambassadors for Development shall not be entitled to a Special identification card. However, they shall be entitled to a business card and the terms of reference and nominations certificate, as well as a special information on the designated country representatives will added in WFWO website, to ensure that they are on official business to support the WFWO activities and should be accorded facilities their mission in their country.

23. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development shall be fully responsible for arranging, at their own expense, such life, health and other forms of insurance covering the period of their services on behalf of the WFWO, as they consider appropriate. They are not eligible to participate in the life or health insurance schemes available to WFWO staff members. The responsibility of the WFWO is limited to cover the insurance coverage under the conditions described in paragraph 19/23 of these Guidelines.

24. Goodwill Ambassadors for Development who are authorized and approved to travel at WFWO expense or who are requested to perform services on behalf of the WFWO shall, in the event of injury, illness or death attributable to the performance of duties on behalf of the WFWO, will be cover by an special insurance during the period of the mission or program development approved by the WFWO.

Communication and Information

25. The designating WFWO Division Team or Program shall ensure that the special skills and talents of all designees are well utilized for the benefit of the Organization, and that designees are provided with regular and appropriate guidance on their activities on behalf of the WFWO. The designating WFWO division Team or Programs shall consult the WFWO Operations Team and Communication Team on activities involving Goodwill Ambassadors for Development, as appropriate.

26. The designating WFWO Division Team or Program shall facilitate communication between their countries representatives and field team regarding the involvement of Goodwill Ambassadors for Development in appropriate field-level activities and events.

27. Each designating WFWO Division or Program shall maintain an updated list of its Goodwill Ambassadors for Development. The designating WFWO Division Team or Program shall ensure that all changes in the status of their designees are communicated in a timely way to the Under - Executive President for Communications and Public Affaires, and are reflected in the relevant public information package materials in a timely manner.

28. WFWO Communication Team shall be the focal point for consultation and communication on policy issues relating to Goodwill Ambassadors for Development and other celebrity advocates, including their designation and status under direct supervision of the Executive President WFWO. The WFWO Communication Team will also facilitate the sharing of information and best practices in the management of relationships with Goodwill Ambassadors for Development Networks.

Termination

29. The designation of a Goodwill Ambassador for Development shall be terminated if, in the view of the Head of the relevant WFWO Board Directors or Program, the designee is unable or unwilling to carry out the role envisaged in the terms of reference, if the Goodwill Ambassador for Development engages in any activity incompatible with his/her status or with the purposes and principles of the WFWO or if the termination is in the interest of the Organization.

Curriculum

30. Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks (ADN) reserves all right to any materials listed by ADN and shown to the applicant. The applicant agrees not to disclose any confidential information issued to the applicant, e.g. user name, or other such information which maybe exchanged with the applicant. The applicant further agrees not to allow others to copy or otherwise utilize any resources or materials provided to the applicant by the ADN Team.

Confidentiality

31. Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks (ADN) will maintain confidentiality in accordance with applicable regulations. All requests for information by or on behalf of the applicant must be requested in writing and signed by the applicant specifically outlining what information the applicant is requesting released. Only that information which is specifically stated in the request by the applicant will be released. The applicant understands that certain state and federal agencies and departments may have access to the applicants

information or as directed by a court of jurisdictional authority. Applicant agrees to allow Goodwill Ambassador to contact current or previous employers, educational institutions or others in the event that a question may arise about the applicant making false or misleading statements, or as may be deemed necessary to ensure that true and correct information was provided to Goodwill Ambassador.

Compliance and Indemnification

32. Applicant agrees to use the services of Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks within all laws and to upload and/or download files, if at all, only with the consent of the copyright or patent of the ADN. Applicant specifically agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Goodwill Ambassador for Development Networks, its officers and employees from any claim, loss or damage, including costs and reasonable attorney fees, arising out of any act or omission of applicant under this agreement.
